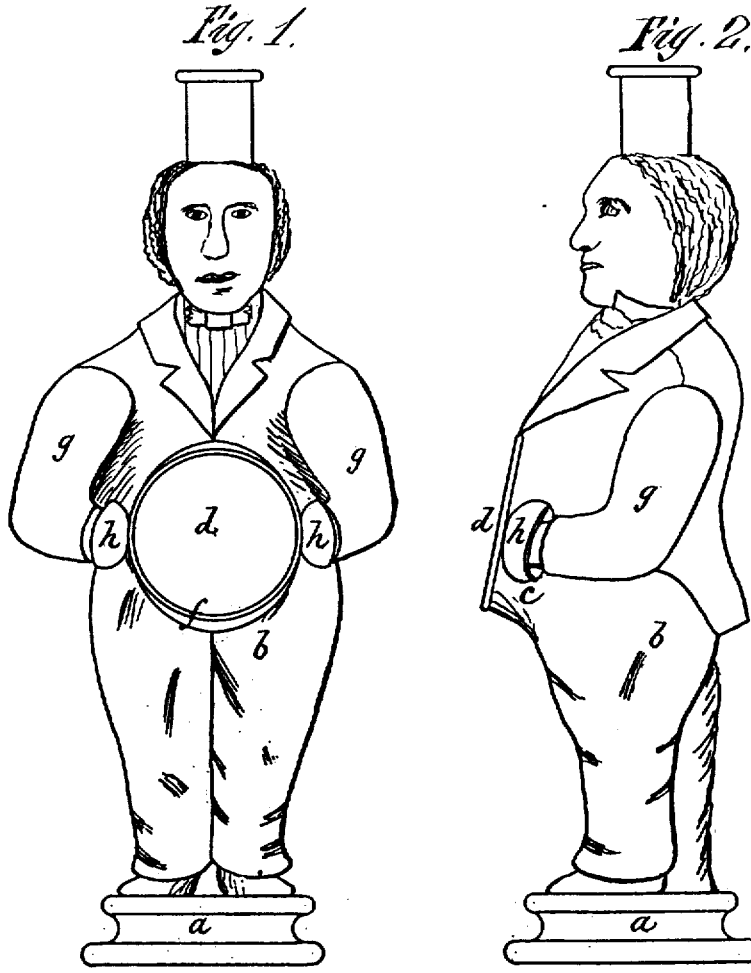

DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,064**, dated February 16, 1875; application filed February 3, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK S. UPTON, of the city of Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Bottles; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a front elevation. Fig. 2 is a side elevation.

My design consists of a bottle representing a man standing upon a pedestal, with a disk formed upon the abdomen, surrounded by a projecting bead, and with the elbows bent, and the hands entering pockets at the sides of the disk, as hereinafter described.

a represents the pedestal. *b* is the figure or image which stands upright thereon. *c* is the abdomen. *d* is the circular disk, having a plain face, and surrounded by a projecting bead, *f*. The disk stands somewhat angular, as shown. *g g* are the arms, which are bent; and *h h* are pockets at the sides of the disk, into which the hands enter, as shown.

The distinguishing feature of this design is the disk *d*, formed upon the abdomen, surrounded by the projecting bead *f* and the pockets *h h* at the sides, with the hands resting therein.

This bottle is used for holding hair-oils and perfumeries, and the disk serves as the attachment for a label.

What I claim as new is—

The design for a bottle, consisting of a figure with the disk *d* formed upon the abdomen, surrounded by a projecting bead, *f*, and provided with pockets *h h* at the sides, in which rest the hands of the figure, as herein shown and described.
