DESIGN FOR AN ALTO-RELIEVO.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,066**, dated February 16, 1875; application filed December 19, 1874.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM B. GLEASON, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for an Alto-Relievo, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

This design for alto-relievo is preferably made in wood, molded in dies, and may be attached to articles of furniture, or used in rooms or buildings for decorative purposes; but may be made in any suitable material, and may be attached to other articles besides furniture, as stoves, picture-frames, &c.

A is the face or head, surrounded with a hood or chaplet, B, composed of part *a* and parts *b*. The part *a* crosses above the forehead and has bars *c*, and the parts *b* hang or

depend from part *a*, as shown, and parts *b* are also provided with bars *d*. On part *a* is also a series of smaller bars, *e*, and on *b* are two or more long beads, *f*. The collar G is composed of curved beads or bars *g*, of a waved bead, *h*, and of a lower bead, *i*.

The face might be differently shaped without departing from my design.

I claim as my invention—

The design for an alto-relievo, consisting of face, hood, and collar, substantially as shown and described.
