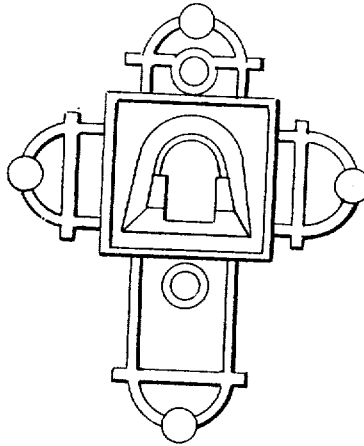

DESIGN FOR COFFIN-HANDLE SOCKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,067**, dated February 16, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN R. MACKAY, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Coffin-Handle Socket; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the socket by which to attach the handle to coffins, and for like purposes; and it consists in the peculiar configuration or outline of the socket, as more fully hereinafter described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.

The center or base is quadrangular. From each of the four sides an arm projects, less in width than the sides, and forming a cross, of which the said quadrangular base is the center. These arms may be of length to form a Latin cross, or cross of other character.

I claim—

The design for coffin-handle socket, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
