

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,068, dated February 16, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAX MOLL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Cigar-Box, of which the following is a specification:

ing is a specification:
The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made; and it consists in a cigar-box in the shape of a cross, with equal subdivisions.

A represents a cigar-box, which is constructed in the shape of a cross, forming, by partitions, interior subdivisions or smaller boxes, which are made to correspond in size to the cigars packed therein, each subdivision taking up a certain quantity of the number to be placed in the box. The cover B is made of

two halves, which are hinged to the outer sides, and joined in longitudinal direction in the center line of the box.

The design forms quite a unique and striking shape for the purpose of exposing cigars in the show windows and cases, and for other purposes.

I claim as my invention-

The design for a cigar-box made in the shape of a cross, with interior subdivisions, and having the hinged cover, substantially as shown and described.
