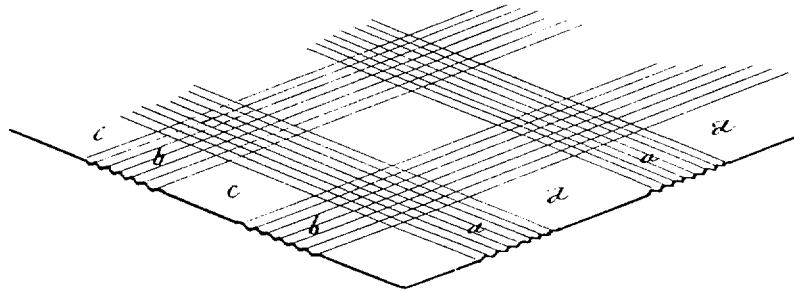

## DESIGN FOR WRITING-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S.070**, dated February 23, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

### CASE B.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY D. CONE, of Stockbridge, in the county of Berkshire and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Design for Writing-Paper; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for pattern-ruling writing-paper; and the design consists in alternate longitudinal corrugated sections and plain spaces combined with similar transverse alternate spaces and sections.

A plain-surface paper has longitudinal sections *a* of corrugations run upon said plain surface, said sections distant from each other, so as to leave a plain space, *d*, between each

two of said corrugated sections. Transversely across these sections and spaces similar corrugations *b* are run correspondingly distant from each other, so as to leave a space, *c*, between each two of said corrugated sections, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The effect of this design is to give to the surface the appearance of checks of different tints.

I claim—

The design for writing-paper, consisting in a surface of alternate longitudinal plain spaces and corrugated sections combined with transverse like alternate corrugated sections and plain spaces, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
