

DESIGN FOR WRITING-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.071, dated February 23, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY D. CONE, of Stockbridge, in the county of Berkshire and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Design for Writing-Paper; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for pattern-ruling writing-paper; and the design consists in alternate plain and corrugated sections, as shown in accompanying illustration.

A plain-surface paper has sections a of several corrugations run upon such plain surface,

alternating plain spaces d with corrugated sections between, as shown in the accompanying illustration. These are preferably about equal; but the width of the spaces or corrugated section is immaterial to the design.

The effect of this design is to give to the surface the appearance of alternate strips of different tints.

I claim-

The design for writing-paper, consisting in a surface of alternate plain spaces and corrugated sections, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
