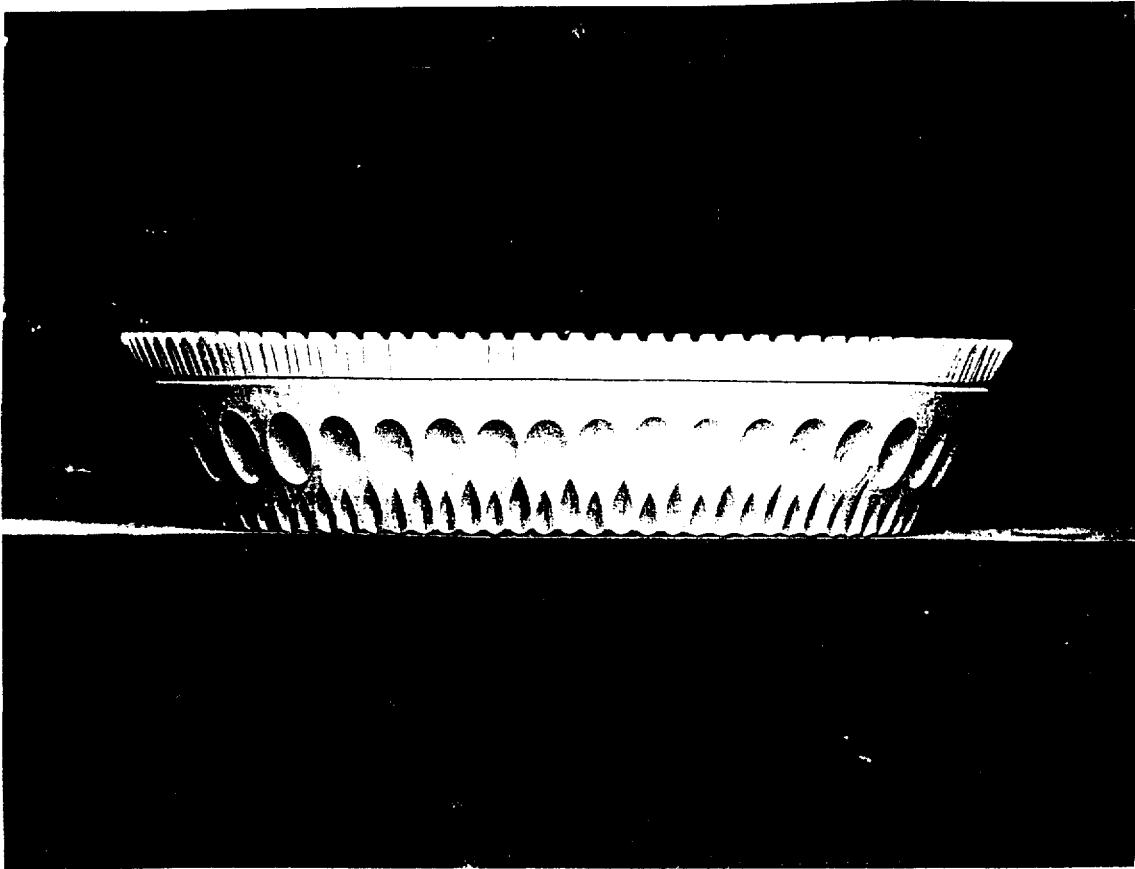

DESIGN FOR GLASS DISHES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,165**, dated February 23, 1875; application filed December 21, 1874.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. LOWRY, of East Cambridge, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for Glass Dishes, of which the following is a specification:

My design is intended for either cut or pressed glass, and has sole reference to the ornamentation of the sides of the article. The nature thereof is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

In the said illustration, A denotes a shallow glass dish, whose sides are tapering or flaring upward. *a* is a groove or channel extending circumferentially around the dish, and at a short distance from its top edge. Above this channel is a series of vertical blocks or panels, *b b*, &c., extending entirely around the dish, and serving to give a turreted appearance to the upper edge of the dish. Extending around the base or lower part of the dish is a series of alternate greater and less conoidal depressions, *c*, while over these is a series

of oval-shaped depressions, *d*, which also extend entirely around the dish.

The bottom of the dish may be either plain or ornamented with any desirable figure or figures.

I am aware that dishes have been formed with scalloped edges or tops, and therefore do not claim such.

Having described my invention, what I claim is—

A design for glass dishes, in which the sides thereof are ornamented by a series of oval depressions, *d d*, &c., a series of conoidal depressions, *c c*, &c., and a series of vertical blocks or panels, *b b*, &c., arranged substantially in the manner as shown and described.
