

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,173, dated February 23, 1875; application filed February 15, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Smith, of Enfield, Hartford county, State of Connecticut, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Inwrought into Ingrain and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings or photographs herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpetweaving a defined and thorough description
