

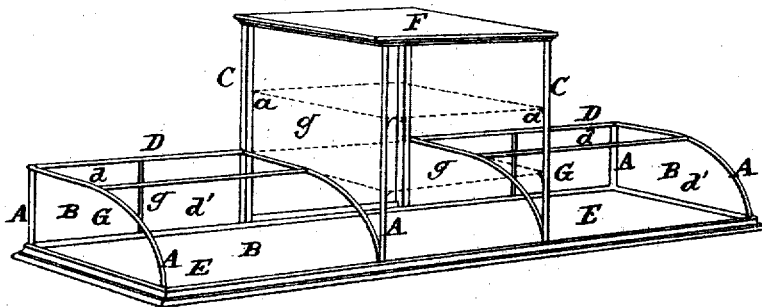

DESIGN FOR SHOW-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,183**, dated March 2, 1875; application filed January 23, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, LAWRENCE WIEGEL, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, and JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of St. Louis, St. Louis county, State of Missouri, have invented a Design for Show-Cases, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A A represent the frame-bars of the case. The bars A A form the supports of the glass panes B B, forming the main part of the walls of the case. The central part of the case has a raised portion, C. The end portions D D have each a flat-topped part, *d*, and an outwardly-curved inclined part, *d'*, in front of the

part *d*. The case has the usual bottom E and the top F.

What we claim as our invention is—

A design for a show case, having the raised central portion C and wings D D of lower elevation, and having flat portions *d* and curved inclined portions *d'*, substantially in the manner above described.
