

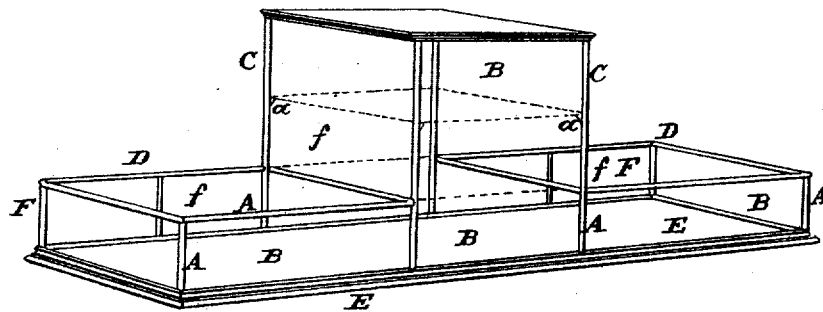

## DESIGN FOR SHOW-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S. 184**, dated March 2, 1875; application filed January 23, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years]

### CASE A.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, LAWRENCE WIEGEL, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, and JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of St. Louis, St. Louis county, State of Missouri, have invented a Design for Show-Cases, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A A represent the frame-bars of the case, fitted to support the glass frames B B, which constitute the main part of the walls of the case. At the central part of the case is a raised portion, C. The end portions or wings D D are flat-topped, to enable the handling of

articles thereon. The case has the usual bottom E and back F.

What we claim as our invention is—

A design for a show-case having the end portions or wings D D, with flat tops extending across the case, and central portion C, of greater elevation, substantially in the manner above described.
