

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, LAWRENCE WIEGEL, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, and JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of St. Louis, St. Louis county, Missouri, have invented a new and original Design for a Show-Case, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying drawing is a perspective view of a show-case, in which the nature of

our design is fully represented.

Our case consists essentially of a central compartment or receptacle, A, and two divisions or wings, B B', which latter are arranged with reference to said central compartment, as shown. Of these three compartments of the case the one, A, has a vertical front, a, while the wings have bowed or outwardly-curved fronts, as shown, respectively, at b b'. C C'

represent the flat tops of wings B B'. The top of the central compartment is flush or level with the tops of the adjacent wings. E represents a general frame-work for the case.

We claim as our invention-

The design for a show-case, consisting of a central compartment, A, with vertical front a and horizontal top D D', which latter is on a level with the flat tops C C' of wings B B', whose fronts are bowed at b b', in the manner shown
