## DESIGN FOR FOUNTAINS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,186, dated March 2, 1875; application filed February 24, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph W. Fiske, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain Improvements in Design for Fountains, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is hereby made.

The design consists of a basin, in the center of which is a group of figures of children, two or more in number, resting on a turtle or other object, and apparently supporting a vase or other tubular article, intended to serve as a tube or support for the jet of the fountain. The basin is, in turn, supported by two or more human figures resting on a rustic base,

as represented in the illustration. It also represents the figure of a child in the act of climbing into the basin at one side; but, as is obvious, this may be omitted if desired without materially altering the general design.

As represented in the photograph, the basin is of the style known as the "shell" pattern; but other forms of basin may be substituted without departing from the general character of my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a fountain, as herein described and shown.
