DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,198**, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 15, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, the remainder of the design being merely a repetition of that which appears.

The design consists of the two vine-like members *a* and *b*, so interlocked as to inclose spaces *d* and *e*, the former of which is furnished with a central ornament, consisting of a group of leaves, *f*, and the latter with an ornament, consisting of leaves *g* and sprigs *h*, and both of the spaces *d* and *e* being furnished with minor ornamentation too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

1. The design for the vine-like ornaments *a* and *b*, interlocked so as to inclose spaces *d* and *e*, as shown and described.

2. The design for the central ornament, consisting of a group of leaves, *f*, as shown and described.

3. The design for the central ornament, consisting of leaves *g* and sprigs *h*, as shown and described.

4. The design for the whole pattern, including the ornaments *a* and *b*, the group of leaves *f*, and the leaves *g* and sprigs *h*, as shown.
