## DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,198, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 15, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Alfred Heald, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, the remainder of the design being merely a repetition of that which

appears.

The design consists of the two vine-like members a and b, so interlocked as to inclose spaces d and e, the former of which is furnished with a central ornament, consisting of a group of leaves, f, and the latter with an ornament, consisting of leaves g and sprigs h, and both of the spaces d and e being furnished with minor ornamentation too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim-

1. The design for the vine-like ornaments a and b, interlocked so as to inclose spaces d and e as shown and described

and e, as shown and described.2. The design for the central ornament,

consisting of a group of leaves, f, as shown

and described.

3. The design for the central ornament, consisting of leaves g and sprigs h, as shown and described.

4. The design for the whole pattern, including the ornaments a and b, the group of leaves f, and the leaves g and sprigs h, as shown.
