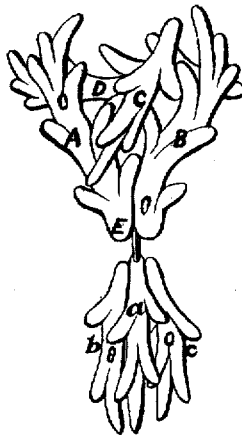

## DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN AND PENDANT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,201**, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 24, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

### CASE A.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Breastpin and Pendant, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

This invention relates to a rustic-work design, which consists, with respect to the breastpin, of four branches of trees, A B C D, two of which are connected together at their bases E, and diverge from such bases upward. The branch C is situated in reverse to the branches A B, while D is a cross-branch extending beneath the other branches.

Referring to the pendant, the letters *a b c* designate three branches, situated parallel to each other, or nearly so, and the branch *a* above the joint of the two other branches.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a breastpin, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the breastpin and pendant, substantially as shown and described.
