

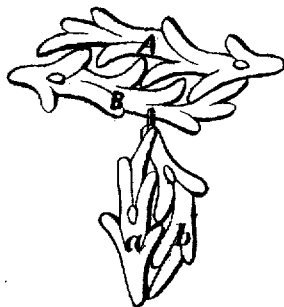

DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN AND PENDANT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,202**, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 24, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Breastpin and Pendant, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

This invention relates to a rustic-work design, consisting, with reference to the breastpin, of two branches of trees, A B, which are similar, or nearly similar, to each other, and are situated tip to base. Referring to the pendant, *a b* designate two branches, also

similar, or nearly similar to each other, and situated tip to base or extending in reverse directions.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a breastpin, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the breastpin and pendant, substantially as shown and described.
