DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,203**, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 24, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Breastpin, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

This invention relates to a rustic work design, consisting of three branches of trees, A B C, which are connected together at their inverted bases D. From the bases D the three branches diverge downward in such a

manner as to form a symmetrical triangular figure. Between the branches are situated buds E of fuchsias.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a breastpin, substantially as shown and described.
