

DESIGN FOR PAPER-WEIGHTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,205, dated March 9, 1875; application filed February 26, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OTTO F. FOGELSTRAND, of Kensington, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Paper-Weight, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

A represents the weight proper, and B its hundle. The sides of the weight A are formed of a plain band at the base, above which is a cove, then a straight-sided but tapering portion, between which and the top there is another cove. The surfaces of the top of the

weight, the two coves, and the tapering portion between said coves are ornamented in relief, the tapering portion being bordered by a raised ledge, and the coves are ornamented by U-shaped ledges, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a paper-weight, in which the sides of the weight proper are composed of the band, coves, and tapering portion, ornamented substantially in the manner above described.
