GUSTAVUS STORM, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR PERFUMERY-BOTTLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,210**, dated March 16, 1875; application filed February 8, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GUSTAVUS STORM, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Perfumery-Bottle, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

My design for perfumery-bottle represents a youth of an exceedingly stout round figure, standing in an easy attitude, with the hands inserted in the side pockets of a short jacket

or roundabout. The neck of the bottle projects upward from the head of the figure.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a perfumery-bottle, in the form of a youth of an embonpoint figure standing on a base-piece in an easy attitude, with the hands inserted in the side pockets of a short roundabout or jacket, as herein shown and described.
