DESIGN FOR A STATUE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,211, dated March 23, 1875; application filed March 4, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, DOMENICO BARSE-LOTTI and VENANZIO ALLUISI, both of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Statue, of which the following is a specification:

The drawing represents a photographic

view of our design.

This invention relates to a design for a statue, A, which is intended particularly for tea-stores, and which represents the figure of a Chinese girl. The peculiarities of our design are the head-dress a, the string of pearls b, which is suspended from the neck of the girl, a cup, e, and saucer d, which rests on the right hand, and a fan, e, is held in the left hand. Next to the right foot of our statue are two boxes f, one on top of the other. The left foot rests upon a bunch of leaves. The dress h is cut according to Chinese fashion.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a statue, Λ , composed of the figure, head dress a, and string of pearls b, as shown and described.

2. The design for a statue, Λ , holding cup c and saucer d, and fan c, as shown and described

3. The design for a statue, Λ , having the dress h, as shown and described.
