## DESIGN FOR A STATUE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,211**, dated March 23, 1875; application filed March 4, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, DOMENICO BARSELOTTI and VENANZIO ALLUISI, both of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Statue, of which the following is a specification:

The drawing represents a photographic view of our design.

This invention relates to a design for a statue, A, which is intended particularly for tea-stores, and which represents the figure of a Chinese girl. The peculiarities of our design are the head-dress *a*, the string of pearls *b*, which is suspended from the neck of the girl, a cup, *c*, and saucer *d*, which rests on the right hand, and a fan, *e*, is held in the left hand. Next to the right foot of our statue are two boxes *f*, one on top of the other. The left foot rests upon a bunch of leaves. The dress *h* is cut according to Chinese fashion.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a statue, A, composed of the figure, head dress *a*, and string of pearls *b*, as shown and described.

2. The design for a statue, A, holding cup *c* and saucer *d*, and fan *e*, as shown and described.

3. The design for a statue, A, having the dress *h*, as shown and described.
