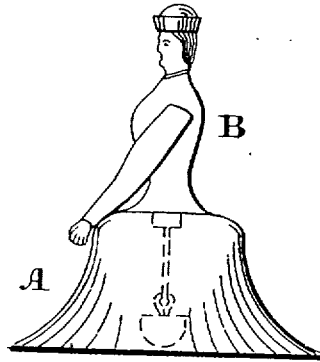
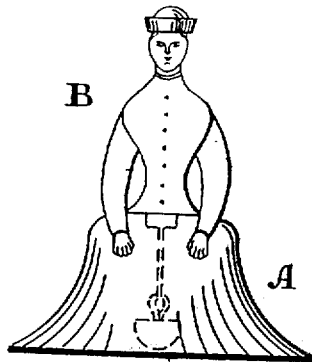

## DESIGN FOR CALL-BELLS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S. 222**, dated March 23, 1875; application filed March 8, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HUGH S. KERR, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Bells, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 is a side view, and Fig. 2 is a front view, thereof.

A represents the bell, and B the handle thereof. The handle is constructed of the form of a figure or body from head to waist, and the

bell A may be said to be the skirt of a dress, so that the handle and bell present the appearance of a dressed figure.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a bell, in which the handle and bell present the appearance of a dressed figure, of which the bell is the skirt thereof, and the handle the body of the figure, as described.
