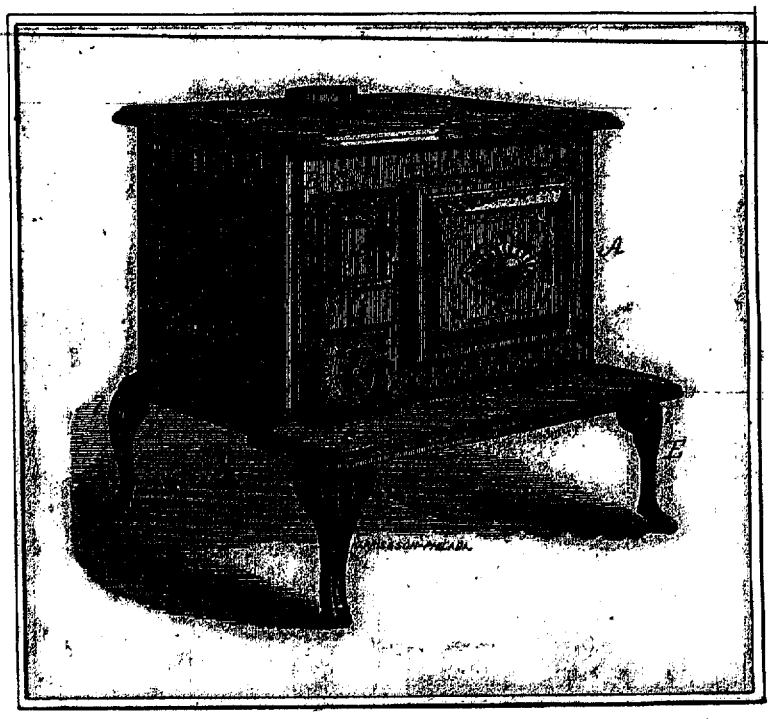

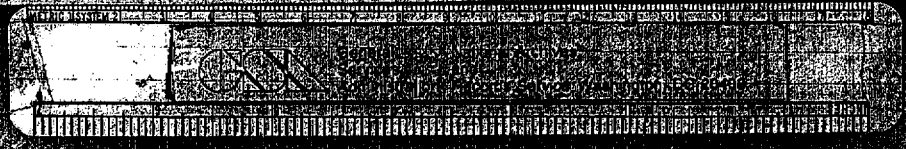

DESIGN FOR STOVE-PLATES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,224**, dated March 23, 1875; application filed March 15, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, GARRETTSON SMITH and HENRY BROWN, pattern-makers, of the city of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for certain Plates of Stoves, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying engraved illustration of a flat-top cooking-stove, to which reference is made.

The edge moldings of the oven-door A, fire-door B, ash-pit door C in front, and of the side panels D D are alike, as shown. The projecting or low relief portions of the doors A and B are beveled, and an ornamental scalloped border or molding, 1 1, rests along the base of the beveled projection of each, as shown. The faces of the beveled projections of the doors A and B, respectively, are flat, with the exception of the ornamental center-piece 2 and surrounding narrow bead or molding 3 in the door A, and the beaded molding 4 in the door B, as shown. The face of the

ash-pit door C curves outward at its lower end, and is surrounded by the same scalloped border or molding 1 as shown in the doors A and B. The projecting or low relief faces of the side panels D D have beveled edges and flat surfaces, respectively, as shown, and the same form of ornamental scalloped border or molding 1 1 as shown in the doors A B C. Above the ash-pit door C is a projecting base, 5, as shown. The front edge of the hearth-molding 6 is, in transverse section, an ogee, and square, as shown. The legs E E are each of a curved form in length and width, and have raised edges at their sides, and a central ornament, 7, in front, as shown.

We claim as our invention—

The design for the plates of a stove, the same consisting of the parts specified, shown, and described.
