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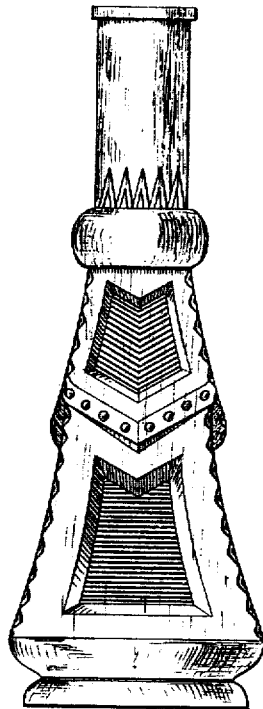

FRANCIS STORM, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR PERFUMERY-BOTTLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,227**, dated March 23, 1875; application filed March 10, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS STORM, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Perfumery-Bottle, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

My design for a perfumery-bottle is intended to represent a monument, and is made somewhat in the form of a pyramid, the four sides of which are slightly curved, and each corner or angle ornamented with an ogee-molding. The base is formed of round molding, and panels with flutings are made in the sides with indented moldings. The upper portion of the body at the junction of the neck is formed

with half-round projections, and resembles somewhat the capital or head of a column, on the upper side of which pointed moldings, which encircle the neck, are formed.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a perfumery-bottle, the contour of which is of a pyramidal shape, rising up from a square base, with the sides slightly curved inward, ornamented at the top with a half-round projection or capital, around the neck with pointed moldings, and at the corners or angles with ogee-moldings, as herein shown and described.
