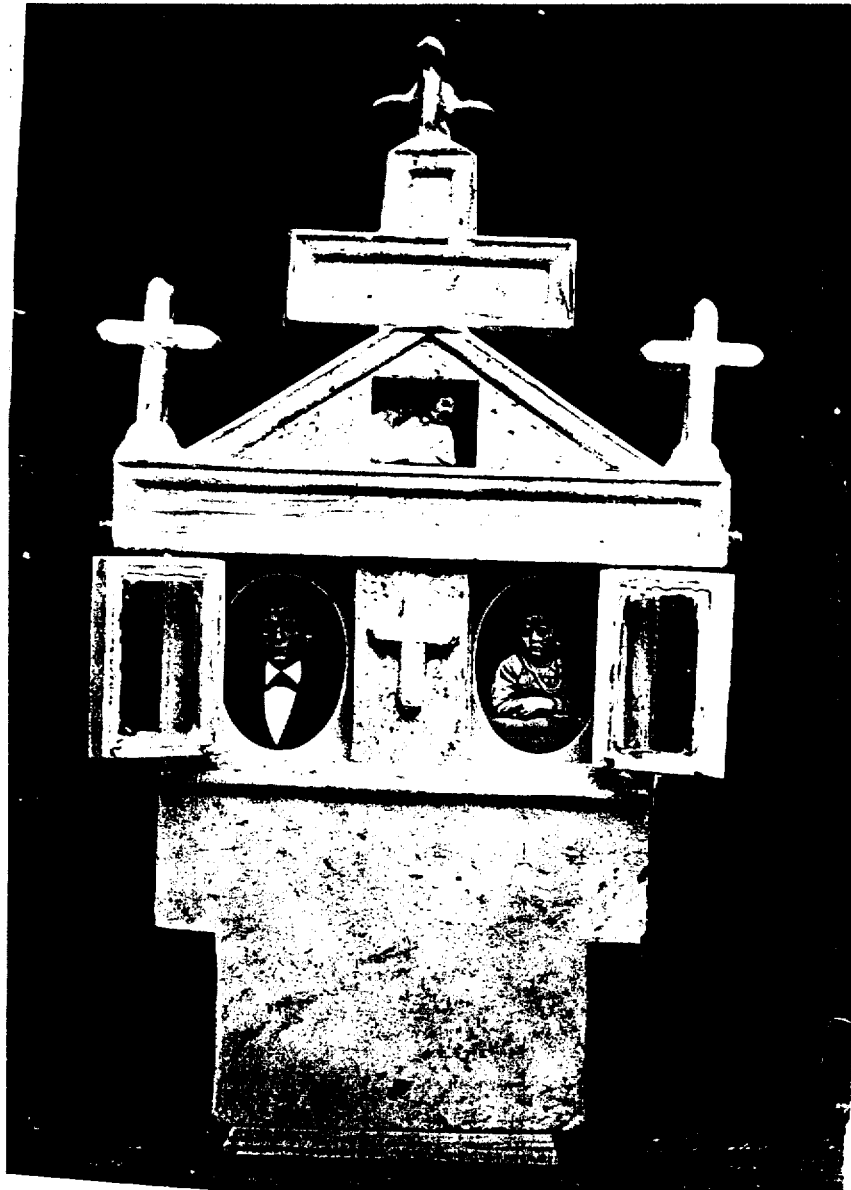

DESIGN FOR MONUMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,229**, dated March 30, 1875; application filed March 6, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANTON LINGEMANN, of Port Huron, in the county of St. Clair and State of Michigan, have invented a Design for Cast-Metal Head-Stones for Graves, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the head-stone, which may be cast in iron or other metal, with two compartments cored in the upper part for the reception of portraits, which may be protected from the elements by two glazed doors, *a a*. Under these compartments is a belt-course molding, and above it is a horizontal panel, *b*, above which a third portrait-compartment is cored in the pointed upper part of the stone,

also protected by a glazed door, *a'*. The upper part of the stone is surmounted by the upper part of a cross, *c*, which may be surmounted by the figure of a dove, *d*, although the latter is not an essential feature of my design. At each corner of the stone a small cross, *c'*, is erected.

The name of the deceased, or the family name, may be molded, inscribed, or otherwise placed in prominent letters in the sunken panel *b* without varying my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a metallic grave-stone, substantially as described and shown.
