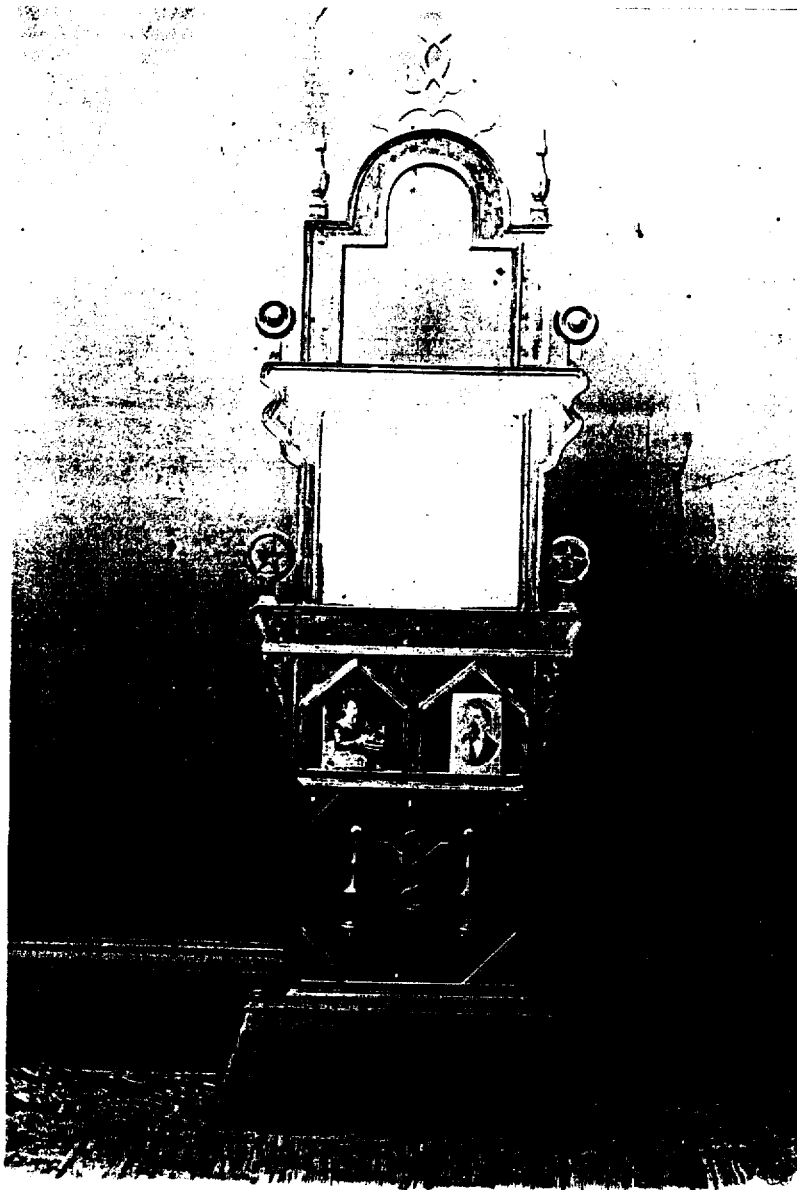

ANTON LINGEMANN, OF PORT HURON, MICHIGAN.

DESIGN FOR MONUMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,230**, dated March 30, 1875; application filed March 6, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANTON LINGEMANN, of Port Huron, in the county of St. Clair and State of Michigan, have invented a Design for a Cast-Metal Head-Stone for Graves, of which the following is a description:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the lower part of the head-stone, separated from the upper part A¹ by a bracket belt-course, *a*, the top edge of the part A¹ being finished with a heavy cornice, *b*, at the sides. In the upper part of the part A two compartments, *c c*, are cored in, each adapted to receive a photographic portrait, which may be protected from the destructive action of the elements by glazed doors or movable frames. Below the portrait-receptacles a sunken octagonal panel, *d*, is formed in the lower section by a raised molding, which panel can be filled with masonic or other emblems in alto-relievo, as shown. At the ends of the

bracket-course *a* a five-pointed star is inclosed in a ring, *e*, mounted on a short column, as shown. The part A¹ has a square panel to contain the name of the deceased and accompanying inscription, in raised letters, which may be cast on the tablets, formed by movable letters attached to the pattern. A rosette, *f*, is mounted at each end of the bracket *b* at the top of the part A¹, from which rises an arch, A², in which a flower pot or basket may be suspended. The arch is sprung from two columns, one at each side, each surmounted by a pinnacle, *g*, while the finial ornament on the arch is a crown, *h*, of any open ornamental pattern, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a cast-metal grave or head stone, of the configuration and ornamented as herein represented and described.
