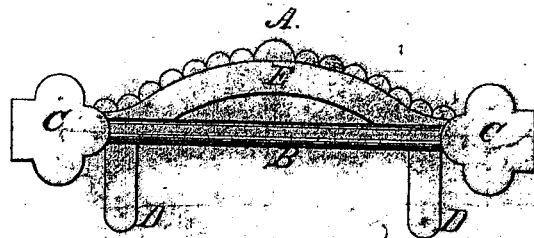

DESIGN FOR TOWEL-RACKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,254, dated March 30, 1875; application filed March 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CORNELIUS TEN EYCK, of White House Station, in the county of Hunterdon and State of New Jersey, have invented a Design for Towel-Rack, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents a towel-rack, containing a roller, B, journaled in extended supports C, at right angles to the back frame and at the extremities thereof. These supports are of the shape substantially of a clover-leaf or trefoil, and are of an ornamental character. Some distance inside these supports are two pendants, D, attached to the back frame,

above which and spanning the distance between the same is an arch, E. This I may ornament by making the top loped or ornamental by crest-work. Essential features of the design are the arrangement of the supports, the pendants, and the intervening arch.

What I claim, therefore, as my invention is the design for a towel-rack consisting of supports for the roller attached to the back frame, having pendants D and an intervening arch, E, substantially as described.
