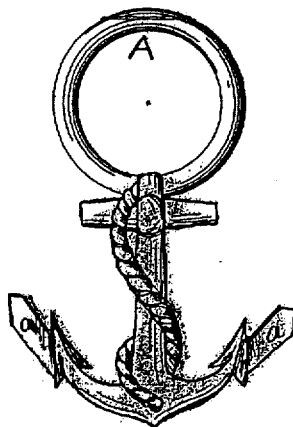

## DESIGN FOR A CLIP OR FASTENER FOR SUSPENDING CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,258**, dated April 6, 1875; application filed February 26, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

### CASE A.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. MCGILL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Clip or Fastener for Suspending Cards and other Articles, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification; and consists in a piece of metal struck up and shaped to represent an anchor.

The suspending-ring is the ring of the an-

chor, marked **A** in the drawing. The usual fastening-prongs extend from the flukes of the anchor, and are marked *a a* in the drawing.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a clip or fastener for suspending cards and other articles, herein shown and described.
