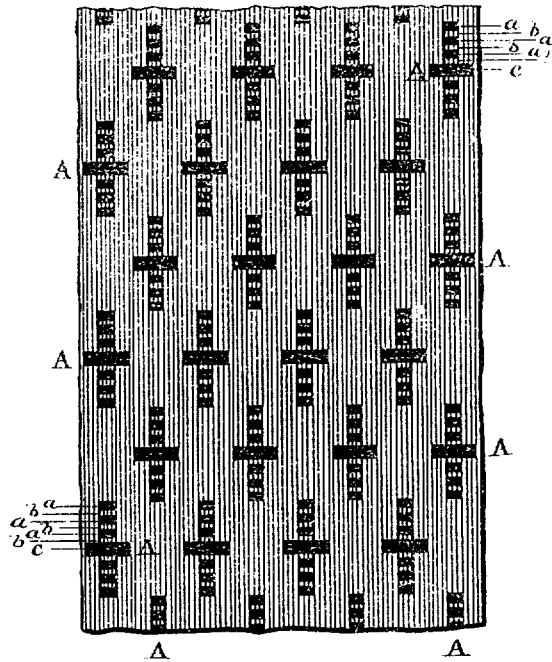

DESIGN FOR FANCY CASSIMERE FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,263**, dated April 13, 1875; application filed March 29, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, FREDERICK SNOW BOSWORTH, of the city and county of Providence, State of Rhode Island, have invented a new Design for Fancy Cassimere Fabrics; and I do hereby declare that the following specification, taken in connection with the drawings making a part of the same, is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

The optical effect of my novel design will be apparent on an inspection of the accompanying drawings. Said effect is produced by means of a peculiar composition and combination of the crosses A, which are placed equidistant from each other laterally and transversely upon a ground of plain weaving, and so arranged as to appear in longitudinal, transverse, and diagonal lines, and in diamond pattern. The cross A is composed of a long and a short arm at right angles to each other.

The long arm is formed of a number of short transverse bars, *a a*, separated from each other by small recessed spaces *b b*. A single bar or block, *c*, forms the short arm of the cross, which is placed transversely upon the center of the long arm.

The fabric may be woven in any preferred variety of colors for giving effect to the design, the characteristic feature of which is the composition and combination of crosses upon a ground of plain weaving, as above described.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for fancy cassimere fabrics, as herein set forth, and represented in the drawing.
