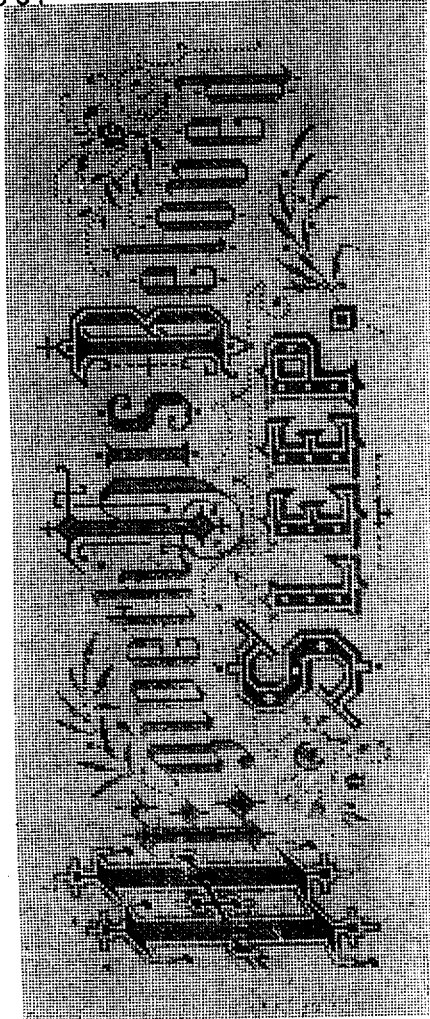

DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board; and it consists in the peculiar configuration and ornamentation of the motto, as shown in the accompanying illustration. The motto, forming the principal feature in this design, is, "He giveth His beloved sleep." The first four words are in a segmental

line over the last word. The forms of the letters composing these several words are clearly shown in the illustration, the capitals being the principal feature in this part of the design. The ornamentation consists of a vine-work or branches, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, consisting of the motto "He giveth His beloved sleep," in form and ornamentation as shown in the accompanying illustration.
