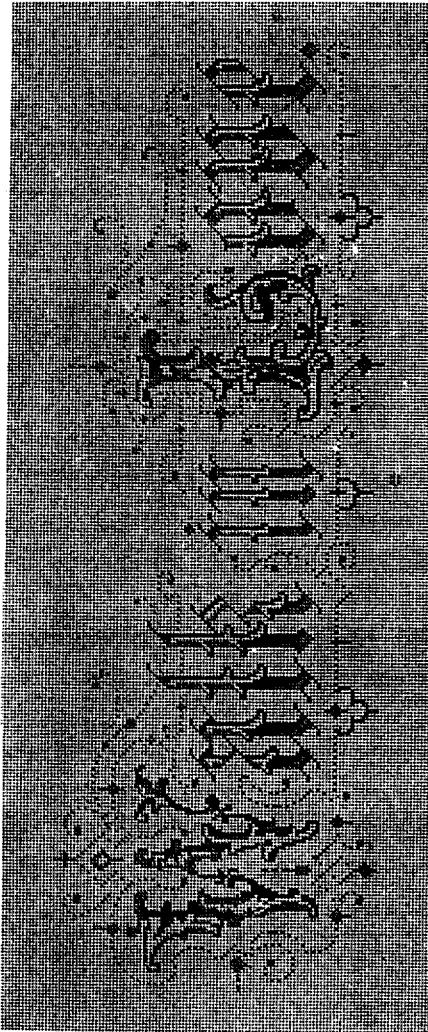

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board; and it consists in the peculiar configuration and ornamentation of the motto, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The motto, which is the ground of this design, consists of the words "Walk in Love." The peculiar shape of the capitals constitutes the principal characteristic of the design.

The ornamentation consists of a tracery around, or interwoven with, the letters, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, consisting of the motto "Walk in Love," in form and ornamentation, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
