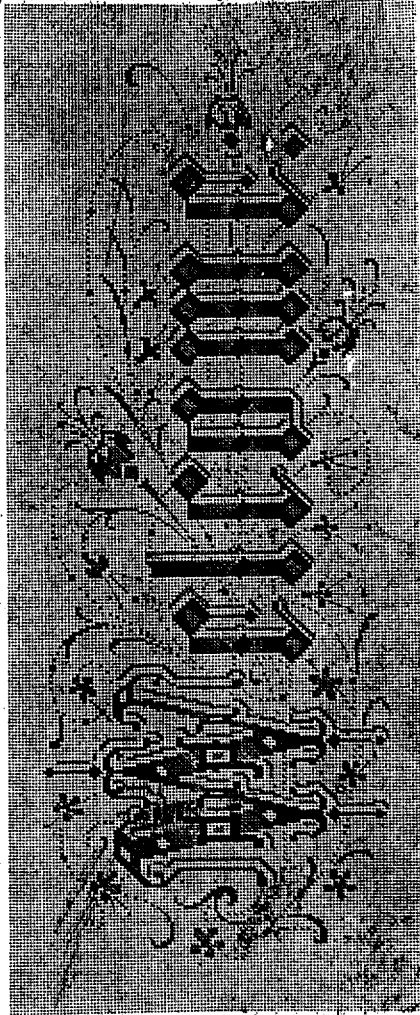

DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board; and it consists in the peculiar configuration and ornamentation of the motto, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The word constituting the base of this de-

sign is "Welcome." The peculiar shape of the capital constitutes the principal characteristic of the design. The ornamentation consists of a floriated tracery springing from the letter "W," and interwoven with the remaining letters.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, consisting of the word "Welcome," in form and ornamentation as shown in the accompanying illustration.
