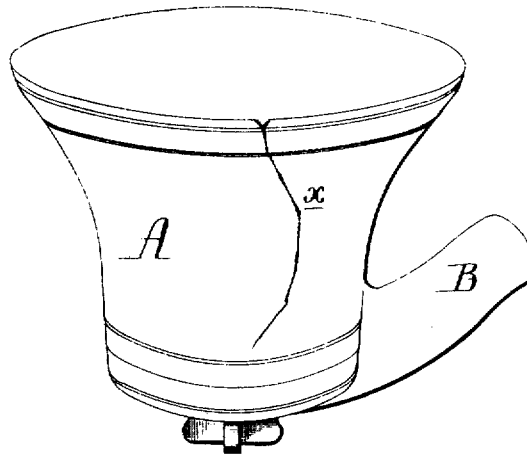

## DESIGN FOR A PIPE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,269**, dated April 13, 1875; application filed April 2, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER J. D. HENSZEY, of Ashland, Camden county, New Jersey, have invented a Design for the Bowl of a Pipe, of which the following is a specification:

My design for the bowl of a pipe is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, and consists of a representation of a cracked bell, A, the design being a fac-simile in miniature of the bell in Independence Hall, Philadelphia.

The stem B of the pipe is connected to the bell at one side in the manner clearly shown in the drawing.

The pipe may be made of wood, clay, meerschauum, or other material, and may have im-

printed or otherwise formed upon it, lettering similar to that on the Independence bell; but this is not essential, the main feature of the design being the representation of the bell with its crack *a*.

I claim—

The design for the bowl of a pipe representing the Independence bell, substantially as herein described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
