### DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,274, dated April 20, 1875; application filed April 9, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

#### CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a Design for Breastpin, of which the following is a specification:

This invention is illustrated in the accom-

panying drawing, in which-

Figure 1 represents a face view. Fig. 2 is

a sectional view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. This design consists of an inclined escutchcon bearing heart-shaped shells and an arched lozenge, which contains an oval drop.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, of which a is an escutcheon, the sides of which are slightly inclined from the center downward, and the ends of which have angular enlargements b. In the lower side of the escutcheon a is formed an arch, c, which is surrounded by a lozenge, d, the face

of the latter being ornamented with leaves e projecting from a spiral stem. From the arch c depends a drop, f, of oval form. On the face of the escutcheon a, and on the opposite sides of the lozenge d, are heart shaped shells g, which are ornamented with interior radiations, as shown.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design composed of the inclined escutcheon a, arched lozenge c d, oval drop f, and heart-shaped shelfs g, substantially as shown and described.
