## DESIGN FOR DISH OF POTTERY-WARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,276**, dated April 20, 1875; application filed April 15, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JONATHAN COXON, of Trenton, Mercer county, New Jersey, have invented a Design for Dish of Pottery-Ware, of which the following is a specification:

In the photograph, *a a* represent corrugations, extending from the base *e* of the dish up to the point *b*. *c* designates the smooth projecting rim, having scallops on its outer edge, as shown. Between the point *b* (at which the corrugations *a* terminate) and the edge of the projecting rim *c* is shown a smooth portion, *d*, without any ornamentation whatever. The scallops on the edge of the rim al-

ternate with the corrugations on the body of the dish.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a dish of pottery-ware, consisting of the exterior corrugations *a*, extending from the base *e* of the dish up to the point *b*, the smooth projecting rim *c* with scallops, as shown, and the smooth portion *d* on the under side of the rim, between the said corrugations and scallops, the whole arranged substantially as described.
