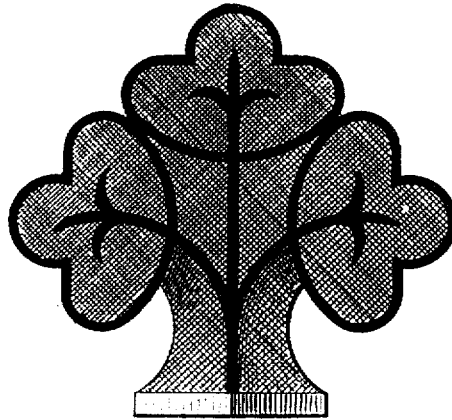

DESIGN FOR COFFIN-SCREWS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,277**, dated April 20, 1875; application filed March 27, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NEHEMIAH HAYDEN, of Essex, in the county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Coffin-Screws; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the head of what are known to the trade as coffin-screws; and the design consists in the peculiar configuration of the head, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The head is substantially flat upon its two surfaces, and represents three shamrock

leaves—one forming the central tip, and one branching to each side, as shown in the illustration.

The shape of the base from which the leaves branch is immaterial to this design.

The branch and outline of the leaves are indicated by a plain band, the intermediate surfaces matted, or otherwise finished.

The outline of this head, which represents the branch of shamrock, is the peculiar characteristic of this design.

I claim—

The herein-described design for coffin-screw head, consisting of the representation of three shamrock leaves.
