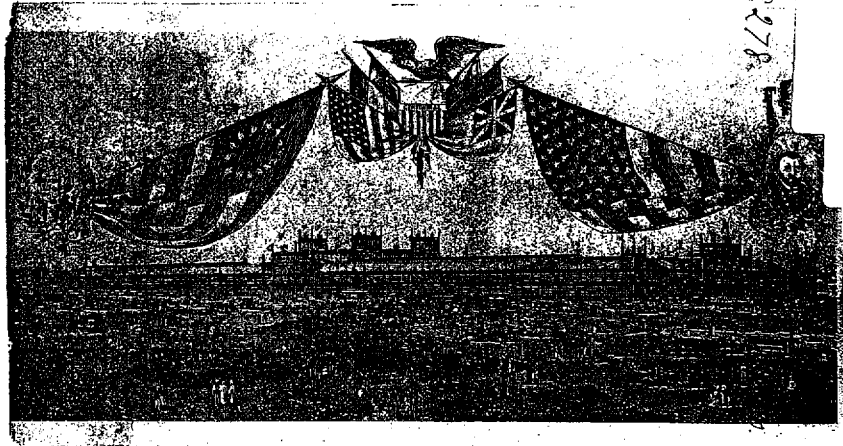

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,278, dated April 20, 1875; application filed March 29, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY C. LEES, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a Design for a Badge, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a badge is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

At the lower portion of the badge, and extending almost entirely across the same, is a representation of the main building of the Philadelphia International Exhibition of 1876. Over the picture of the building is arranged an ornamental figure, B, comprising an eagle, a shield, and flags of different nations. Near each end of the badge is a medallion, D, containing a portrait, and extending from each of the medallions D to the central ornament is a draped flag, F. The badge may be made of

textile or other material, and the design may be printed or otherwise produced upon the same, but these features I do not claim; but,

What I claim is—

The design for a badge comprising the representation of the building A, the ornament B, medallions D, and draped flags F, all substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying photographic illustration.
