

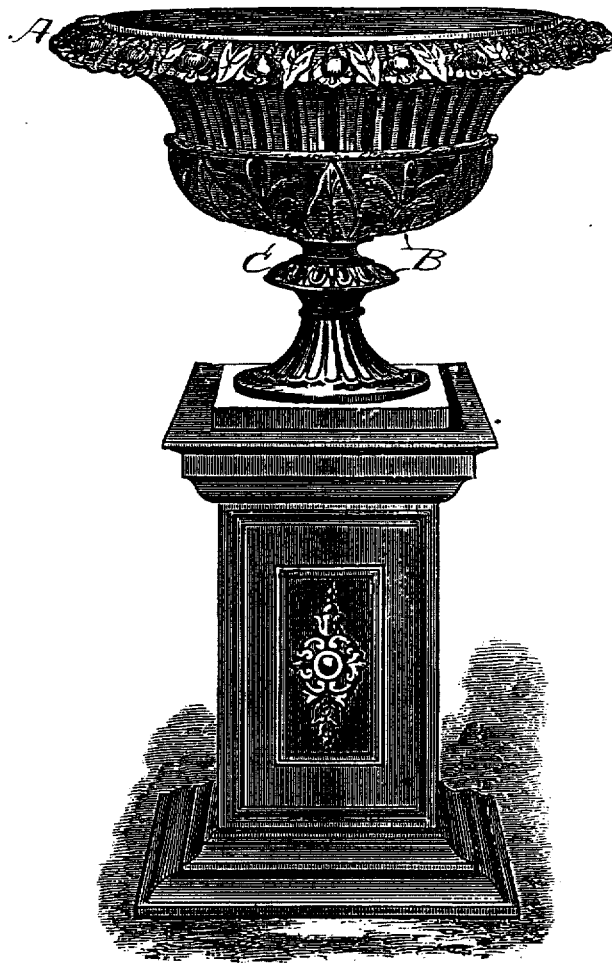

## DESIGN FOR VASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,281**, dated April 20, 1875; application filed March 20, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM TWEEDDALE, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Vases and Fountains, of which the following is a specification:

My design for vases and fountains is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made, the said design being the floral border of morning-glories on the flange A, surrounding the top, and the cat-tail B and water-leaf ornamentation C of the exterior of the bowl.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for the top border A of a vase representing morning-glories, substantially as described and shown.
2. The design for the bowl of a vase, ornamented with representations of the water-leaf and cat-tail, as described and shown.
