

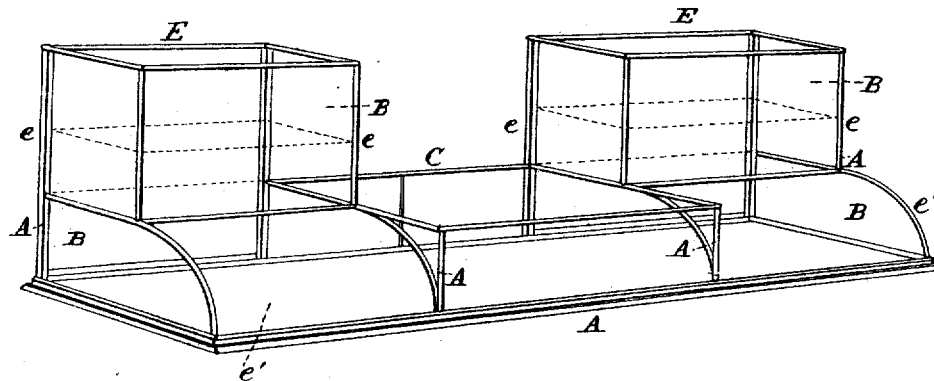

DESIGN FOR SHOW-CASES AND STANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,287, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 14, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of St. Louis, St. Louis county, State of Missouri, have invented a Design for a Show-Case, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The case has frame-bars A, of metal, wood, or other suitable material. In the frame are set glass panes at B, in the usual manner. The central portion C of the case has a flat transparent top of such elevation, as shown, as to allow the convenient handling upon it of articles for sale, the flat top extending the whole width of the case. At each side of the central portion C are portions E, of greater ele-

vation at the rear *e*, and having in front a convex-faced part, *e'*, as shown. The top of the portions E may be flat, as shown, or may be ornamented in any suitable manner. The said tops may be opaque or transparent. The bottom and back of the case may be made in the usual manner.

I claim—

The design for a show-case with flat-topped central portion C and elevated ends E, with convex-faced fronts *e'*, all substantially as above set forth.
