

## DESIGN FOR SHOW-CASES AND STANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,289**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 14, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

## CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of St. Louis, St. Louis county, State of Missouri, have invented a Design for a Show-Case, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The case has frame-bars A, of metal, wood, or other suitable material. In the frame are set glass panes B, as usual. The central portion C of the case is flat-topped from front to back, and of such a height as to suit for handling thereon articles for sale. The end portions D are of greater elevation at the rear d, where they are provided with bulged or

convex faces d'. The front of each end D is below the level of the top of the central portion, and has an inclined face, d'', and vertical face d'''. The bottom and back of the case are of the usual form, modified as to the back, to suit the rear of the frame.

I claim—

The design for a show-case with flat-topped central portion C and ends D, of greater elevation at the rear, with faces d' d'' d''', all substantially as above set forth.
