DESIGN FOR BEER-MUG.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,290**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 10, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN ERNEST MILLER, of Pittsburg, Allegheny county, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Beer-Mug, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the plain part of the body of the beer-mug. B represents a series of flat surfaces. C and *e* represent the base, concaved at *e*, and forming a bead at C. D represents the handle, which would form an oval

if viewed in cross-section. The ornamentations at B C *e* and the contour of the mug as an entirety are the essentials of my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a beer-mug, in which a series of oblong flattened surfaces are formed upon the body, and an annular concavity at the juncture of said body with a bead-shaped base, substantially as herein described and shown.
