## DESIGN FOR GOBLET.

Spec fication forming part of Design No. **8.291**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 10, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN ERNEST MILLER, of Pittsburg, Allegheny county, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Goblets, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represent-

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the plain portion of the body of the goblet; and B its ornamental bottom. The stem e of the pedestal, which supports the body, is hexagonal in form, enlarged at C and also at D, where it joins the base or foot f. The flat surfaces of the stem e terminate at B and D, forming leaf-like ornamentations and V-formed surfaces in outline at C.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a goblet, in which a hexagonal-shaped stem is enlarged at its points of juncture with a like-shaped pedestal for supporting the body, and with the base or foot, the flattened sides of said stem terminating above in **V**-shaped surfaces in outline, and below in leaf-like outlines, substantially as shown and described.
