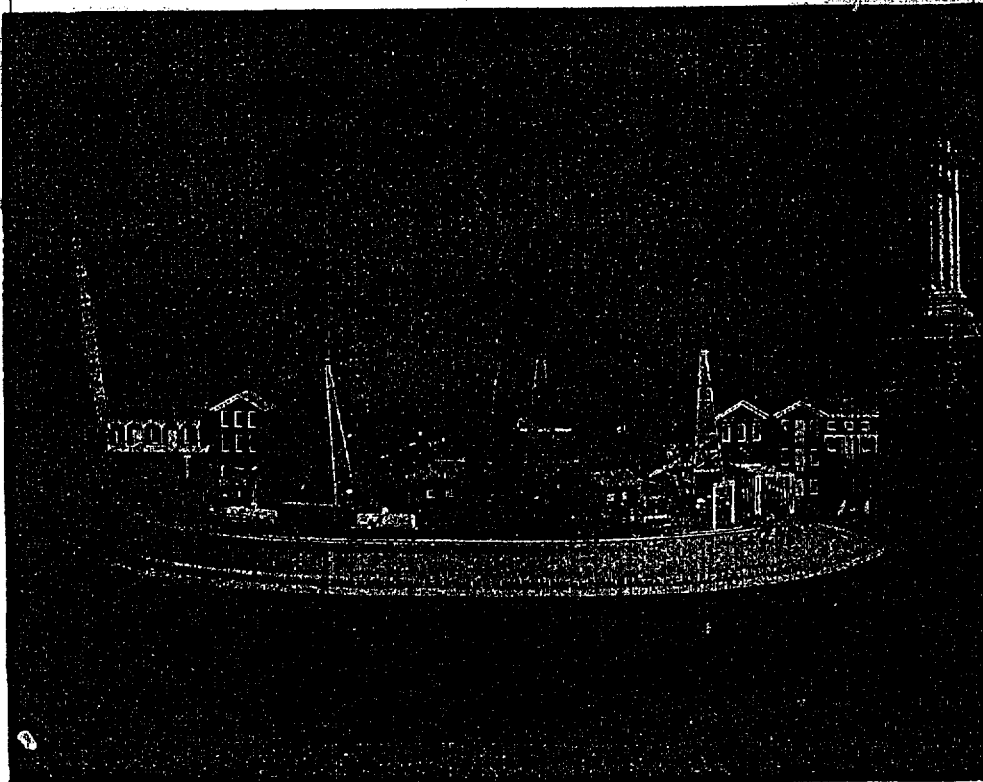

DESIGN FOR A TOY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,292**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 3, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN STIDHAM, of South Oil City, in the county of Venango and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Model of an Oil-Farm, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the ground of the farm. B are the offices. C are the shops. D are derricks for operating the drills for sinking the wells, and the pumps for securing the oil. E represents a driver, team, and wagon transporting an oil-tank. F is a pile of wood. G is a man hewing timber. H are men locating a well. I is a tank for storing oil. J is

a train of cars, two of which are loaded with oil-tank. K is the railroad-track. L is a tank receiving oil from a well. M is a bridge over a water-course. N are arches for roadways leading through the building.

The model is intended to illustrate the entire process of working an oil-farm.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a toy representing the derricks, tanks, rail-tracks, shops, offices, and other appliances and apparatus of an oil-farm, substantially as described and shown.
