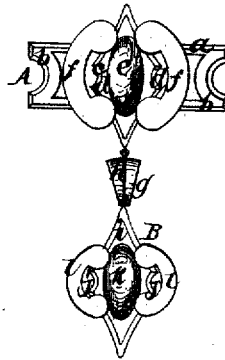

DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN AND PENDANT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,298**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 9, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a Design for Breastpin and Pendant, of which the following is a specification:

This invention is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents a face view, and Fig. 2 a sectional view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

This design consists, as to the breastpin, of an oblong escutcheon and a lozenge crossing each other at right angles, the lozenge being ornamented with an oval head and with half-oval ears.

As to the pendant, it consists of a lozenge depending from a tapering hook and ornamented with an oval head and with half-oval ears.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, and B the pendant.

Referring to the breastpin, *a* is an oblong escutcheon, which has straight sides and concave ends, and which is ornamented with lines *b*, parallel to the edges. *c* designates a lozenge crossing the escutcheon *a* at or near its center. This lozenge has two acute and two obtuse angles, the latter being broken by depressions *d*. The face of the lozenge *c* contains an or-

namental head, *e*, of oval form, and from the opposite sides thereof extend half-oval ears *f*, which have a partial return bend.

Referring to the pendant, *a* designates a suspension-hook, which has a tapering form, and is ornamented with a row of pearls, *h*. From the tapering hook *g* depends a lozenge, *i*, having two acute and two obtuse angles, the latter being broken, similar to those of the lozenge *c*, by depressions *j*. On the face of the lozenge *i* is an oval head, *k*, and from two opposite sides thereof project ears *l*, similar to the ears *f*, as shown.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for breastpin, composed of the escutcheon *a*, lozenge *c*, oval head *e*, and ears *f*, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the breastpin and pendant, the latter composed of the tapering hook *g*, lozenge *i*, oval head *k*, and ears *l*, substantially as shown and described.
