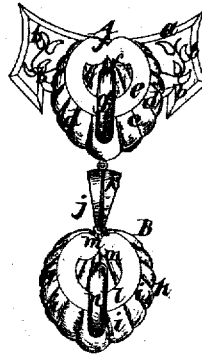
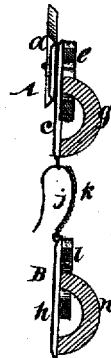

DESIGN FOR BRESTPIN AND PENDANT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,300, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 9, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a Design for Breastpin and Pendant, of which the following is a specification:

This invention is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which Figure 1 represents a face view. Fig. 2 is a sectional view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

This design consists, as to the breastpin, of a curved escutcheon bearing a scalloped shell and an indented ring, the latter being intersected by a raised bead. As to the pendant, it consists of a scalloped shell depending from a tapering hook, and bearing an indented ring intersected by a raised bead.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, and B the pendant. Referring to the breastpin, *a* is the escutcheon, which has curved sides and ends, one of the sides being concave and the other convex, while the ends are concave. The face of the escutcheon is ornamented with leaves *b*, projecting from a spiral stem. On the face of the escutcheon is a scalloped shell, *c*, which has interior radiations *d*, and on the shell rests a ring, *e*. This ring has indentations in its exterior and interior edge, and opposite to these indentations

the ring is crossed by a bead, *g*. The bead is raised above the ring *e*, and has its terminus in the shell *c*.

Referring to the pendant, *h* is a scalloped shell, ornamented with radiations *i*, and which depends from a tapering hook, *j*, bearing a string of beads, *k*. The shell *h* contains a ring, *l*, which has interior and exterior indentations *m*, and is intersected opposite to the indentations by a raised bead, *n*, having its terminus in the shell *h*, as shown.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for breastpin composed of the curved escutcheon *a*, scalloped shell *c*, indented ring *e*, and cross-bead *g*, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the breastpin and pendant, the latter composed of the scalloped shell *h*, tapering hook *j*, indented ring *l*, and cross-bead *n*, substantially as shown and described.
