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

DESIGN FOR DRESS-TRIMMINGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,301, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 9, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL BERNSTEIN, of Mount Vernon, in the county of West-chester and State of New York, have invented a certain new Design for Dress-Trimming, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing.

In the drawing, the letters A B designate two parallel bars, one of which forms the top border of my trimining, and which are connected together by latticed strands C. The upper bar A is ornamented with exterior loops a. From the inner bar B depend leaf-shaped figures D, one-half part of which is closed, or nearly so, compared with the other half, which has the form of waving loops. The closed half of the leaves D is ornamented

with triangular openings b. The closed portion of the leaves D is connected together by strands c, having a zigzag configuration.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—

The design for dress-trimming, composed of the parallel bars A B, latticed strands C, exterior loops a, leaf-shaped figures D, and zigzag strands c, substantially as shown and described.
