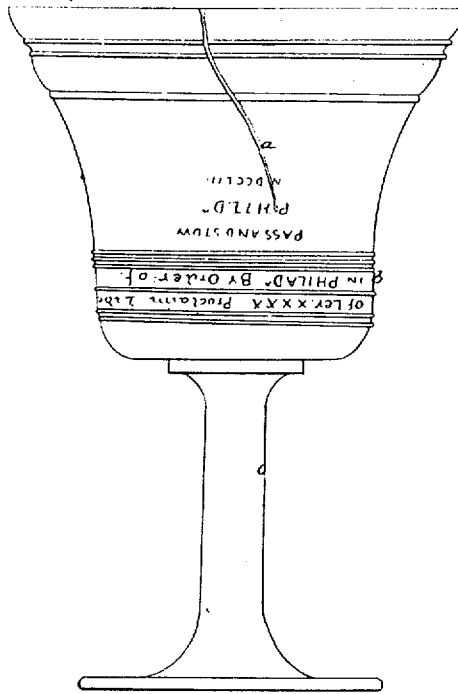

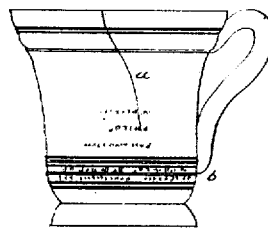

## DESIGN FOR DRINKING-VESSEL.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,302**, dated April 27, 1875; application filed April 23, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, M. DANL. CONNOLLY, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new Design for a Drinking-Vessel; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a representation of my design applied to a goblet. Fig. 2 is a representation of my design applied to a vessel or mug having a handle.

My design for a drinking-vessel, such as a goblet, mug, or tumbler, consists in forming the body *A* thereof to represent the old Liberty Bell in Independence Hall, Philadelphia, the prominent features of which are the fissure *a* and the inscription *b*.

My design relates only to the body of the vessel, and is not limited to any particular character of vessel, so long as the same is either a goblet, mug, or tumbler, or their equivalents, and not a bottle.

I claim—

As a design for the body of a drinking-vessel, the representation of the old Liberty Bell in State House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, with the fissure *a* and inscription *b*, either or both, substantially as shown.
