

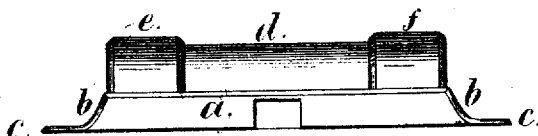

## DESIGN FOR VALISE-LOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,304, dated May 4, 1875; application filed April 19, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

### CASE B.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GUSTAVE BERNHEIM, of the city and State of New York, have invented or produced a Design for Valise-Lock Cases, of which the following is a specification:

Valise-lock cases have generally been rectangular, or nearly so, and attached to a flat plate; but they are objectionable in appearance.

My design is made for obtaining a more handsome and ornamental appearance in the valise-lock case.

In the drawing, Figure 1 is a side view of said case, and Fig. 2 is an end view.

The box-shaped base *a* is made with the ends *b* inclined and curved contiguous to the attaching-flanges *c*.

The case for the lock is made of the center portion *d* and end portions *e f*. This case *d e*

*f* is made arching or semicircular upon the top, as seen in Fig. 2, and the sides and ends are straight.

The corners are rounded, so as not to present any sharp angles, and thereby improve the appearance; and the end portions *e f* are larger in diameter than the central portion *d*.

I claim—

The design of the shape and configuration of the valise-lock case, with the inclined ends *b* to the base, and the semicircular top to the portions *d e f* of the case, as described and shown.
