DESIGN FOR FANS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,305**, dated May 4, 1875; application filed April 16, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE S. FARWELL, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Fans; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

The nature of my invention is a design for a fan composed of a card printed and cut to represent the head and face of George Washington, and attached to an ordinary handle.

I claim—

The design for a fan representing the head and face of George Washington, substantially as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
