DESIGN FOR CLIPS OR FASTENERS FOR SUSPENDING CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,309**, dated May 4, 1875; application filed February 26, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. MCGILL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Clip or Fastener for Suspending Cards and other articles, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification; and consists in a piece of metal struck up and shaped to represent the head of an animal, having a yoke-shaped loop or suspending-ring, A, extending up from behind the ears of the same. The

metal flap B, forming the center of the loop or ring A, and connected at its base with the head, and the pointed lug *e* extending from the chin of the head, serve to connect the clip or fastener to the article to be suspended.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a clip or fastener for suspending cards and other articles, herein shown and described.
